About the role

- To ensure the safety of children and adults crossing the road at a designated point between specified times. The discharge of these duties must not be to the detriment of the welfare of other road users.
- To maintain control over children who are awaiting your instructions to cross.
- To be responsible to the Road Safety Officer and Road Safety Team Leader
- To carry out the duties of the School Crossing Patrol Service in accordance with the Council's policies.
- To carry out the duties with due regard to Health and Safety and Road safety procedures.
- To use all uniform and equipment provided for the safety of yourself, children and all other members of the public, especially when stopping traffic on the Highway.
- To report any problems or difficulties to your supervisor.

- Children and adults cross the road safely.
- An efficient service is provided.
- The role is carried out with due regard to Health and Safety, and Road Safety requirements.
- Due regard is given to personal safety as well as for others.
