- St. Mary's is a one form entry school with 8 classes organised in year groups; Nursery to Year 6
- Our leadership team is comprised of the Headteacher, Deputy Head, SENDCO and 2 x TLR.
- We currently have 212 children currently on roll (Reception to Year 6) and Nursery. We have been consistently oversubscribed for a number of years.
- On leaving St Mary's, our children go on to attend several different secondary schools within the Prestwich and Bury area.
- The school occupies a single building with playground space and a playing field for the children to enjoy.
- We host our own breakfast club and a local provider offers after school (off-site) care.
- We hold a weekly Clergy-led worship in school, along with our schedule of class and school worship.
