Purpose of the post:

- To deliver high quality childcare ensuring that the welfare requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage are consistently met
- To support other staff within the nursery and to work opposite the nursery manager and deputise in their absence
- To work in partnership with parents and carers to ensure that children within our care thrive and are ready to transition into reception
- To be a keyworker for a group of children

- To lead the team and nursery in the absence of the Nursery Manager
- To provide a safe, stimulating environment based on the principles of play that promote the social, physical, intellectual and emotional needs of the individual child
- To assist in the daily setting out and delivery of creative play opportunities that reflect the diverse needs of children and that meet all areas of the Early Years Curriculum
- To actively encourage the role of parent's and carer's in all aspects of their child's care, learning and development
- To identify children's individual needs through observation and tracking
- To plan activities to ensure that children are progressing and thriving
- To work positively and inclusively with colleagues; partner agencies and parents and carers so that the nursery provides a workplace and delivers a service that does not discriminate against people on the grounds of their age, sexuality, religion or belief, race, gender or disabilities
- To attend to the personal and physical needs of children so that their wellbeing is maintained whilst encouraging children to be independent
- Display and showcase the children's work under the direction of the nursery manager
- To participate in staff and other meetings and undertake training and development as required. To undertake paediatric first aid training and keep the qualification up to date
- To ensure compliance with safeguarding and welfare requirements at all times and to ensure that all policies such as health, safety and welfare; emergency evacuation and security and food hygiene are adhered to
- To work as part of a team to ensure that all appropriate records are kept regarding the children's welfare and care e.g accidents and incidents and their development and wellbeing
